The Implementation of Bowen's Theory in Family Problems

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Abstract

Family therapy, as an intervention modality, serves as a professional means to address and ameliorate familial challenges through the involvement of trained experts. Within the realm of family therapy theories, Murray Bowen articulated a perspective positing the inseparability of human emotions from the environmental context. The efficacy of Bowen's family therapy approach in mitigating diverse familial issues is notable. The present study employs a systematic methodological approach, specifically relying on a comprehensive literature review derived from a selection of 15 pertinent articles spanning the years 2010 to 2023. Synthesizing findings from the literature, the Bowen theory emerges as an effective framework for addressing a spectrum of familial challenges, encompassing conflicts within couples as well as issues involving children and parents. This research show that Bowen Theory are effective in solving various families problem.

Abstrak

Terapi keluarga adalah suatu bentuk intervensi yang dapat dilakukan untuk membantu menyelesaikan permasalahan keluarga dengan bantuan dari ahli atau profesional. Teori dalam terapi keluarga salah satunya diungkapkan oleh Murray Bowen yang berpendapat bahwa emosi manusia tidak dapat dilepaskan dari lingkungan sekitarnya. Pendekatan terapi keluarga Bowen efektif dalam mengatasi berbagai masalah dalam konteks keluarga. Dalam menyusun metode yang digunakan adalah studi pustaka secara spesifik dari berbagai artikel yang sesuai dengan topik sebanyak 15 artikel dengan rentan tahun dari 2010-2023. 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INTRODUCTION

Family is a place where individuals can experience warmth and support from their closest relatives. Helmawati (2014) asserts that a family serves as the first environment for a child, where they are influenced and educated informally and naturally. However, at times, families encounter problems or conflicts. Counseling services offer specialized assistance in resolving these familial issues through family counseling. Family counseling involves the application of counseling techniques to specific family situations, focusing on issues within the family dynamics and engaging all family members. This aligns with Syofyan (2015), who views family counseling as an effort to assist individuals within the family in developing their potentials or anticipating issues through the family system, aiming for positive behavioral changes that benefit not only the individual but also other family members. Family counseling can also be defined as an endeavor to aid family members through the familial system, enhancing family communication, fostering optimal personal development, and resolving issues based on the willingness and love for the family. In summary, family counseling addresses issues related to family dynamics and engages all family members in the process, driven by the client's willingness and love for their family.

Within family counseling, several theories have been identified or developed by experts. One of these theories is Bowen Family Therapy, developed by Dr. Murray Bowen. Bowen's theory posits that individuals are products of evolution, and human behavior is significantly influenced by similar natural processes. The Bowen Family Therapy contends that the family is an emotional unit and employs a thinking system to describe the complex interactions among its members. Family members essentially share intensely interconnected emotions, influencing each other's thoughts, feelings, and This theory provides a profound understanding of family dynamics and actions. interpersonal interactions. It's main focus lies on the concepts of individual differentiation, family emotional systems, and multigenerational transmission. This theory helps us view the family as a tightly interconnected system, with a simple idea: how one person in the family affects others. Through this lens, we can explore issues and seek solutions collectively. This aligns with the perspective of Reagan et al. (2021), stating that Bowen's theory views the family as an emotional interconnectedness among its members.

This research aims to describe the implementation of Bowen Family Therapy in the context of family counseling. Through in-depth literature analysis, this study is expected to provide a richer understanding of the successes, obstacles, and potential improvements in applying Bowen Family Therapy in family counseling contexts.Bowen Family Therapy has been one of the prominent theory in the field of family therapy.However,some key concepts are not explained further.This research determined to achieve the key concept of Bowen Family Therapy from prior literature.Effectiveness from the theory and what types of family issues also mentioned in this study.Therefore we seek the implementation of Bowen Family Therapy in family issues, is the theory effective to solve it, and what types of family issues arise in the implementation of Bowen Family Therapy.

The study findings are expected to make a positive contribution to the development of family counseling practices and assist family well-being professionals in providing more effective and relevant services. This research gathered 17 articles in total with only 16 selected.



METHOD

This literature review was conducted following Adlini (2022), which involved data collection processes. Data collection involved understanding and studying theories found in various relevant literature. The literature review comprised four stages: preparing necessary tools, compiling bibliographies, scheduling time, and reading or noting research materials. Data were collected through searching and gathering information from various sources, including books, journals, and previous research. Subsequently, the gathered information was critically analyzed and adjusted to support the propositions and ideas discussed in the article.

RESULT AND DISCUSSION

Sixteen relevant article journals published between 2010 and 2023 were examined and presented in the following Table.

The analysis results of literature data showed that most of them addressed the research question (RQ1) as listed in the table above. Bowen's family systems theory has implications for family issues. According to Bowen, every individual is inherently linked to the emotions of others around them. Individuals have the ability to detach themselves from negative emotional influences from their environment, a concept known as differentiation. Based on the literature review findings, individuals with good differentiation abilities tend to have low levels of anxiety, as revealed by Reagan et al. (2020). Similar research was also presented by Fatma (2019), indicating that low differentiation is found in families with polygamous father figures. In that study, individuals with low differentiation are more vulnerable to stress because they struggle more in their relationships and adapt to life changes. This aligns with Bowen's basic concept that differentiation is a phenomenon of life and a process shaped and modified in relation to one's family of origin and extended multigenerational family (Titleman, 2014).

Based on the literature we analyzed, most articles mention that Bowen's theory is effective in addressing family issues, as per research question (RQ2). Research



conducted by Koranian (2022) revealed that the Bowen approach in counseling single mothers is more effective compared to commitment-based therapy. Differences between the two therapies include dimensions of emotional rejection, difficulty in behavioral execution, impulse control difficulty, lack of emotional awareness, limited access, and ambiguity. Similar research findings were also presented by Mofassali (2016), stating that the Bowen approach is effective in reducing marital boredom and enhancing family forgiveness by creating positive interpersonal experiences and correcting perceptions related to depression. Family counseling with the Bowen approach consists of 10 intervention steps designed to help clients find solutions. These steps include building rapport, evaluating problems, enhancing differentiation, detriangulation, cognitive and emotional models of relationships, family projection process, person-to-person relationships, boundary formation, termination, and follow-up (Fatma, 2019).

Bowen's theory approach can be utilized in various contexts of family issues. Based on the literature review conducted in accordance with RQ3, the Bowen approach can be applied to issues concerning single mothers, child wellbeing, couples facing financial problems, parental acceptance of LGBTQ-indicated children, unpleasant childhood experiences, families with polygamy, children experiencing bullying, multigenerational trauma in African-American families, and marital boredom. Bowen's approach focuses on the emotional processes occurring among individuals rather than pathological theories (Brown, 1999). If family members lack the capacity to consider their responses to relationship dilemmas but react with anxiety to emotional demands, chronic anxiety conditions may arise. In the process of understanding issues arising within family settings, Bowen developed eight fundamental principles in family therapy: selfdifferentiation, triangulation, the emotional system of the nuclear family, family projection process, emotional cutoff, multigenerational transmission process, and sibling position.

CONCLUSION

This literature review concludes that Bowen's theory can be applied to issues within the family setting. Bowen's theory views human emotions as interconnected with others in their environment. The Bowen approach is effective in addressing family issues. According to Bowen's theory, resolving family problems involves increasing selfdifferentiation or the ability to emotionally detach from surrounding influences. The contexts of family issues that can be addressed with Bowen's Theory vary from marital conflicts to conflicts between children and parents, to traumatic conditions experienced by children. Bowen perceives an issue as an emotional process occurring among individuals.

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
